**on the communication from the Ministry of Justice and for Europe
dated 27 January 2020
- printed document 16/7636, 16/7701**

**Informing the state parliament on EU matters;
here: The European Green Deal**
COM(2019) 640 final

On 6 February 2020, the state parliament decided:

- I. To take note of the communication from the Ministry of Justice and for Europe of 27 January 2020 - printed document 16/7636
- II. To establish,
 1. that it welcomes and supports the ambitious goal of the new EU-Commission to assume, as the European Union itself, a global pioneering role in order to become climate-neutral by 2050;
 2. that individual European Green Deal proposals are to be examined in order to determine whether they are sufficient enough to actually achieve the goal of climate neutrality by 2050 and which transformation processes can be expected in the process;
 3. that the measures planned as an ongoing process to implement the objectives of the European Green Deal within the framework of European climate protection and sustainability policy will have an impact on many policy areas relevant to our state - such as the automotive industry in the form of incentives for alternative drive systems, the transport sector, the production of renewable energies, agriculture, the food industry or the construction sector; in this context, it is important to us that, in addition to ambitious CO₂ targets in all sectors, innovative solutions are made possible through openness to technology;
 4. that it will examine the EU industrial strategy announced for March 2020 to steer the entire economy towards climate-neutral and circular-flow oriented production, the Action Plan on Recycling, the EU Biodiversity Strategy, the proposal for stricter limit values for air pollutant emissions and other announced initiatives to see how they correspond or conflict with corresponding initiatives in our state;
 5. that the Under2Coalition can be a further element in driving forward climate protection measures, especially in terms of disseminating best practice models. The state government should therefore make greater efforts to win over regions and cities in Eastern Europe in particular to the partnership.
