**Proposal for a Directive of the European Parliament and of the Council amending Directive 2014/45/EU on periodic road safety inspections of motor vehicles and Directive 2014/47/EU on roadside inspection of the road safety and the operational safety of commercial vehicles circulating in the Union COM(2025) 180 final

The State Parliament notes that there are concerns regarding the proposal for a directive of the European Parliament and of the Council amending Directive 2014/45/EU on periodic roadworthiness tests for motor vehicles and their trailers and Directive 2014/47/EU on roadside enforcement of technical requirements for the road safety and the operational safety of commercial vehicles participating in the road transport sector in the Union. subsidiarity and proportionality concerns.

The State Parliament thus concurs with the opinion of the State Government and rejects the proposed directive.

The State Government is requested to draw attention to the concerns regarding subsidiarity and proportionality during the deliberations of the Federal Council. It is also requested to work to ensure that these concerns are reflected in the Federal Council's decision.

The resolution of the State Parliament will be forwarded immediately to the European Commission, the European Parliament, the Committee of the Regions and the German Bundestag, as well as to the Members of the European Parliament for Bavaria.
